

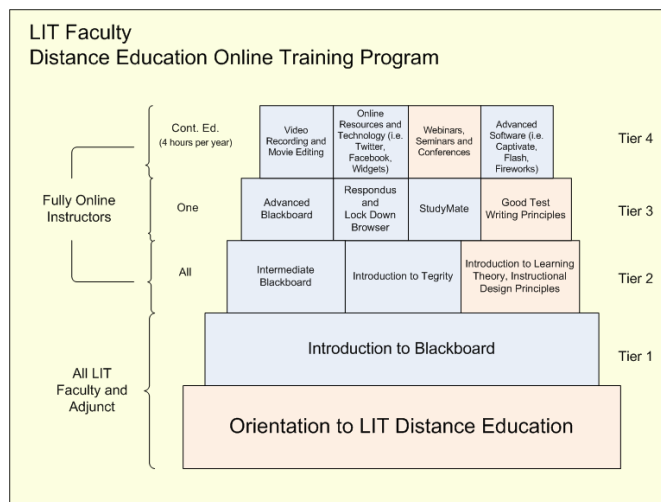

Participants will log into Blackboard, receive an overview of blackboard features, practice using the most common features and view other sample courses. Advanced registration is required.
