

POLICY LIT.9.02 CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

SCOPE: Faculty and Students

1. Each student is expected to behave appropriately while in an instructional classroom setting and to avoid conduct that is disruptive of other students or that interferes with the full participation of other students in the class.
2. In determining whether classroom behavior is appropriate, the instructor shall be the final authority and may direct a student to leave the classroom for the duration of the scheduled class period as outlined in Procedure LIT.9.02.01 Removal of Students.
 - 2.1. If a student's offensive conduct is the result of a documented disabling condition and is unavoidable, then the faculty member will confer with appropriate administrator or with the Special Populations Coordinator.
