

Our Faculty & Staff (Overcame Challenges):

- Total Employees. 254 Diverse Faculty/Staff.
- Educational Attainment: Many Faculty/Staff are 1st Generation Students Themselves.
- Gender. 145 Female and 109 Male.
- Ethnicity: 23.6% of Faculty are Minorities.



How Students Come to Us:

- Total LIT Students. 6,946 (2015).
- Aren't Academically Prepared. 65% Deficient in either Math, Reading, or Writing.
- Can't Pay for College. 64% receive Financial Aid.
- Many are Minorities. 49% are Students of Color and (33.5% of those are) African Americans.



How Students Leave Us:

- \$\$\$ Great Salaries. LIT is #1 (TX)/#3 (US) for the highest student salaries.
- Can Earn up to \$80,000 for AAS in Process Technology.
- Employment Ready. LIT Guarantee states Students will be job-ready or can get retrained for free.
- Help Grow the Economy. LIT has a \$165.3M Economic Impact in Southeast Texas.

Enrollment Down/Skilled Jobs Unfilled/Social Issues






